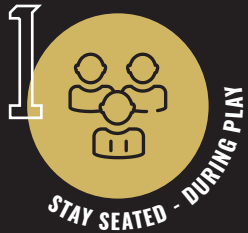


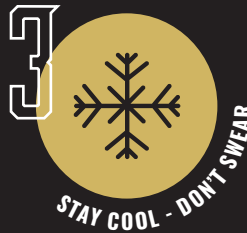

A-Z OF HOCKEY TERMS

With thanks to Puckstop.com which is a great shop for all your hockey equipment needs.

Assist: A credit given to 1 or 2 players (other than the goal scorer), who helped to create the goal opportunity.

Backchecking: The aim is for the defending team to regain possession of the puck.

Crease: A semi-circle area in front of the goal. Offence players cannot enter the crease until after the puck does.

Deke: A play intended to trick an opponent into moving out of position.

Egg: A game's final score is 0.

Five-hole: The space between a goalie's legs.

Grinder: A player praised for working hard on the ice and assisting with goals, rather than being a lead scorer.

High-stick: A penalty for hitting a player above the shoulders with a stick.

Interference: A penalty for obstructing a player not in possession of the puck.

Jibbs: Teeth.

Liney: The linesmen.

Mitts: Player's hands.

Netminder: Goalie.

Official: The referee.

Poke checking: When an opponent pokes the puck away from the other team.

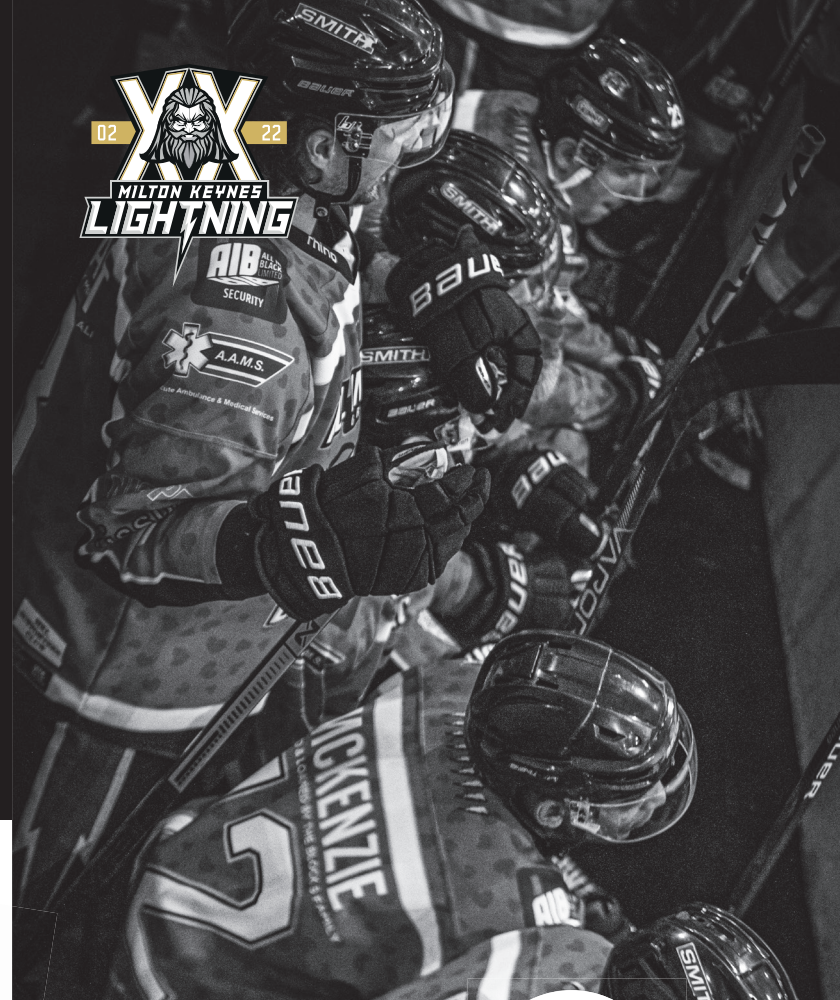
Rebound: When someone takes a shot and the puck bounces off a player or the net.

Top shelf: The upper goal area.

Wheels: Ice skates.

PLAYER PROFILE



Well known as one of the most exciting players in the NIHL National, Liam picked up 41 points in 45 games for Lightning in the 2021/22 season and is always a massive part of our energy and passion on the ice. His background is top quality, 4 seasons in the WHL with Spokane, to EHL appearances with Coventry and Guildford (via the ECHL). He has represented GB at Under 20 and Senior Level, helping secure promotion out of Division 1B in 2016/17. This year Liam is our top goal scorer so far, with 37 goals in 39 appearances and 64 points overall. He's a massive asset to MKL and the sport of Ice Hockey.

ALWAYS TEAM'S NOTABLE PLAYERS



Jason Hewitt grabbed 92 points in 44 NIHL National games last year. He is a talisman for the Steeldogs, a former Steelers stalwart and ex coach of the Hull Pirates. He is an offensive threat every time he is on the ice. Hewitt used his extensive experience from higher leagues to make himself a tough player to pick up and defend against.

Matt Bissonette brings experience from the major junior leagues in Canada and the Elite League. He's an assists machine, with 15+61 for 76 points in 40 games last year, look out for his playmaking skills and slick passing.



Jonathan Kirk is a consistent stay at home defenceman who is a commanding presence on the blueline and goes about his business with a quiet efficiency. You'll generally see him in the right place at the right time.
